Ephesians 6:1-4 6 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 2 "Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise: 3 "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth."

4 And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord.

As I reflect on my dad's impact on my life, I am grateful for his Godly example, but I still am impacted by a few negative words that he said to me. It was through his dying days that God truly stretched me. He allowed me to forgive him for those words that were spoken to me. God drew me closer to my dad, but more importantly closer to Him. God showed me that my dad was going to die, and I was to share the plan of salvation at his funeral. I was in my late thirties at the time and the thought of doing this scared me. God gave me the strength I needed, and through this I felt the call to full time ministry. My dad's death brought new spiritual life for me.

Take time to reflect on your children this Father's Day. Are you spending time investing in them? Because of the coronavirus, we have had so much more time to invest in them. I remember as a young Christian going to a conference and hearing Josh McDowell share, "How do kids spell love? TIME." Are you spending time with your children? Are you bringing them up in the training and admonition of the Lord? Or are you provoking them to wrath? It is not too late to change.

Finally, spend time with your Heavenly Father. God is not like your earthly father. He

is perfect and without fault. Reflect on Him this Father's Day and show your children the grace that He shows you.

using day-only volunteers. Dozens of homes were completed or brought close to completion so that the next few weeks will see many families return home after 21 months away!
