Thank you for your continued support for the SYBA Food Pantry ministries especially since we've been coping with Covid-19! We have felt your prayers. The Amity Hill food pantry has assisted families with a pre-determined time and pick-up service. The Front Street food pantry has offered drive-thru assistance every Wednesday morning. Noel Williamson, our SYBA Executive Director has served on the front line, praying with everyone as their vehicle comes through the line. We hope it won't be much longer before folks are able to come inside our Food Pantries and hear God's eternal message one on one.

Our food and hygiene shelves at both locations have remained stocked and ready for helping local families through your generous donations. Some of our churches have hosted food drives and we've received monetary assistance from individuals, churches and special Covid-19 grants, allowing us to purchase the most needed items. We've helped almost 150 families with 300+ individuals since mid-March.

I wanted to share one of my favorite donation stories with you. A lady came by our Front Street location one Wednesday morning prior to anyone else arriving for the day. She handed me a check for \$120.00 and said it represented 10% of her stimulus money. She told me that she had grown up hungry and never wanted to hear about children going hungry in today's world. She challenged me to make sure our Food Pantry helped all we could with her donation. She has been an SYBA Food Pantry client, and I'm sure could have used that \$120.00 for herself, but she wanted to honor God and His blessing to her. How about you? Please seek ways you can be a blessing to others as we hopefully end our stay at home days soon.

"We are making decisions weekly about future

mission teams and projects. The Partnerships I work with, Armenia and South Africa, are very different in what we can do in 2020. Door of Hope in South Africa has suspended volunteers for the remainder of 2020 as they do not expect the peak of Covid-19 to happen there until mid to late summer. Armenia is still hoping to have teams come in late summer or fall. I am encouraging teams that have had to cancel trips to consider donating some or all of the funds they planned to use for the trip to support the national leaders and churches they planned to serve.

May 18 - 23 I am excited to take a team to Truett Camp and Conference Center to replace two roofs. We will practice social distancing and stay in separate rooms at night, but are very excited to serve the great folks at Truett.

Our Hurricane Florence Rebuild Centers are reopening on May 15 for small groups. You can register your teams by <u>clicking here</u>. There are hundreds of surviving families still waiting on help.
